NOCHES DE CIENCIAS: PROCEDURES & PROPOSAL FORMATS

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I. About Noches De Ciencias

Noches de Ciencias – Family Science Nights - is a national week-long initiative during Hispanic Heritage Month that engages the Hispanic community in relaxed environments to have fun with science and engineering and promote college awareness in a bilingual setting. SHPE student and professional chapters across the United States and Puerto Rico connect their local communities with activities for K-12 students and informative bilingual workshops for parents. The goal of Noches De Ciencias is to broaden the participation of Hispanics along all segments of the science and engineering pathway.

II. Dates

The official dates for the 2010 SHPE/AHETEMS Noches De Ciencias are Sunday, October 3 through Saturday, October 9, 2010.

III. Format

The Noche De Ciencias is a 3 - 4 hour evening event following the prescribed agenda, which includes a bilingual welcome, student activities, parent workshops in English and parent workshops in Spanish.

AHETEMS, Inc. will provide the two prescribed activities, rubrics for the activities and the respective supplies. In addition, AHETEMS, Inc. will provide its copyrighted presentations in both English and Spanish to be presented during the two required parent workshops.

IV. Pre-Scribed Content

Each official SHPE or SHPE Jr. chapter may host only one Noche De Ciencias. Each Noche De Ciencias must meet the following requirements in order to be eligible to receive the maximum funding allowed.

- 1) Be held during the week of October 3-9, 2010, of Hispanic Heritage Month.
- 2) Host 100 K-12 students (parents/guardians or any adults do not count), with more than 50% Hispanic representation.
- 3) Conduct the minimum of two prescribed hands-on activities.
- 4) Host two college preparation/awareness workshop each in English and in Spanish for parents (i.e. total of four workshops).

AHETEMS will provide the activities and the presentations. Host SHPE chapters will be responsible for the logistics and execution of the event.

If the SHPE chapter fails to meet any of the listed requirements, then it will only be eligible to receive a percentage of the requested funds. This percent will be determined by AHETEMS, Inc.

V. Combined Event Requisites

In the event that two or more official SHPE student and/or professional chapters commit to hosting a combined Noche De Ciencias, the following requirements must be met.

- 1) Host 100 K-12 students, with more than 50% Hispanic representation per every host SHPE Chapter (i.e. If two SHPE chapters host an event, then 200 students must attend).
- 2) Host the duplicate minimum of two prescribed hands-on activities (i.e. host 2 stations for Activity A; host 2 stations for Activity B).
- 3) Host two college preparation/awareness workshops in English for parents.
- 4) Host two college preparation/awareness workshops in Spanish for parents.

If, in combination, the SHPE chapters fail to meet any of the listed requirements, then they will only be eligible to receive a percentage of the requested funds. This percent will be determined by AHETEMS, Inc.

Joint chapters must submit individual proposals. Proposals must reference partnering chapters.

VI. Funding

Student and professional SHPE chapters interested in hosting a Noche De Ciencias must submit a proposal through the ACE Mini-Grants Program. Please refer to that document for format and submission requirements.

VII. Submission Deadline

Noches De Ciencias proposals must follow the ACE Mini-Grant Proposal Guidelines and be **postmarked** by August 23 to AHETEMS, Inc. The proposal does not have to be as extensive as the typical ACE proposal.

VIII. Proposal Components

I. Program Name:

XI. Evaluation:

IX. Review Process and Notification

Proposals will be peer-reviewed to select those chapters that will host a Noche De Ciencias. Notification will be sent via email to the selected sites beginning September 10.

X. Funding

Each SHPE chapter will be allowed a **maximum budget** from AHETEMS up to \$800 to cover the costs associated with hosting the event. An indirect cost of \$300 will be utilized by AHETEMS, Inc. to purchase and provide the necessary supplies for the pre-

determined activities. The **additional \$500 (maximum limit)** may be provided to the SHPE chapter to cover additional costs such as copies, food, etc.

SHPE chapters will receive \$250 prior to the approved event. The remaining disbursement will not be released to the chapter until all final reports and paperwork is submitted to AHETEMS, Inc.

XI. Partnerships

This is an official SHPE/AHETEMS event only. Additional non-profit organizations wishing to provide funding and have name recognition, in whole or in part, must contact the AHETEMS, Inc. for approval.

XII. Reports

SHPE chapters will be required to complete the reporting paperwork required for any ACE-funded event. This includes ACE End-of-Event Form, program evaluations, and demographics forms. All information must be submitted as one comprehensive report with all supporting documentation.

Chapters, which conducted a combined event, may submit one report. However, all documented evidence of program evaluations and demographic forms must be included.

Failure to do so will preclude chapters from receiving the additional \$250 and from applying for future funding to host a Noche De Ciencias.

XIII. Timeline

Nov. 15	Remaining approved funds will be disbursed
