AHETEMS concluded another successful AHETEMS Pre-College Symposia, which is the largest national conference for college bound Hispanic students in STEM.


More than 200 middle school students from Phoenix Preparatory Academy and 550 high school students attended the conference in Phoenix from Nov. 13 – 15. In addition, 40 teachers attended the first ever Teacher Program, and gained valuable training, materials and supplies to incorporate into their lesson plans to reach out to underrepresented youth.

Mr. Jaime Escalante delivered the powerful message of educational success through self-discipline, something called “*ganas*” that we are each equipped with, but don’t all use. In his subtle yet solid method, he conveyed the message clearly, and the students, chaperones, educators, staff, and dignitaries applauded him with a standing ovation – as they knew that had just witnessed a lecture from a legendary educational icon.
